

Rules for Sorting and Putting out Garbage

Charged Burnable Garbage

Oversized garbage should have garbage tickets, or "gomi-shori-ken" directly attached to them.

- Plastic items (size under 50cm on a side), leathers and rubbers
Remove the metal parts.
- Old clothes and fabrics
All materials.
- Futons
Roll up and bundle and attach "gomi-shori-ken" to them.
- Wood items, branches, boards
Cut up to pieces with the size smaller than 10cm thick and 50cm long and bundle up.
- Kitchen waste
Drain off the water.
- Cooking oil
Perfuse in paper or rag, or use the coagulation agent.
- Leaves and weeds
Remove soil, dry and put out in the designated bags.
- Toilet sand for pets
- Diapers
Remove the filth.
- Paper waste

※ Each garbage bag should be compact enough to be handled by one hand to prevent breakage during handling.

Charged Non-burnable Garbage

Oversized garbage should have garbage tickets, or "gomi-shori-ken" directly attached to them.

- Metal items, glass
Sharp or pointed items such as blades and broken glass must be wrapped in thick paper and placed in a designated bag. Attach a notice saying "Kiken" on the bag.
- Portable heaters
Drain the fuel completely and remove the batteries.
- Carpets (smaller than 6-jo size)
If cut to pieces with a size smaller than 50cm on a side, put out the carpet as Burnable garbage.
- Cassette-type gas containers, aerosol cans
Empty the containers completely and put in separate bags from other Non-burnable garbage.
- Soil, sand and stones from gardening
Each garbage bag should be compact enough in order to prevent breakage during handling.

● Plastic items with size 50cm on a side and larger
● Cans with size longer than 20cm

Important!

The city does not collect following items:

The waste in transparent bags that are not designated or cardboard boxes even with "gomi-shori-ken" attached to them.

Free of Charge Container Plastics

Put in transparent garbage bags. ★ Empty the containers. ★ Rinse the inside with water. ★ Remove the caps.

Plastic containers with a mark
 ※ If not cleanable, put the dirty items as Burnable garbage.

- Tubes
- Nets
- Trays, packages, cups
- Styrofoam
- Compound aluminum material
- Plastic bags, wraps
- Bottles, caps

Free of Charge Cans, bottles, PET bottles

Put in transparent garbage bags. ★ Empty the containers. ★ Rinse the inside with water. ★ Remove the caps.

● Cans
Cans, with size smaller than 20cm

● Bottles

● PET bottles
Bottles with PET marks

- Paper caps and cork caps are Burnable garbage.
- Metal caps are Non-burnable garbage.
- Plastic caps are Containers plastics.

Free of Charge Batteries

● Manganese and alkaline batteries
The collecting boxes are in town halls and city hall branch offices.

Batteries that the city does not collect

● Button-batteries coin-batteries nickel hydride batteries lithium-ion batteries and other small-sized batteries
should be taken to stores with the collecting boxes.

Items that the city does not collect. (For details, please inquire) 51-0796

- TVs, air-conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, drier machines
- Microwave cookers, PCs, word-processors
- Kerosene tanks (90 liters and larger)
- Waste difficult to handle (tires, batteries, fire-extinguishers)
- Waste from business (regardless of the size)
- Large amount of waste as a result of moving, or year-end cleanings cannot be collected at one time.

Charged Oversized Garbage

By request
 1 Call first. (see below)
 2 Attach "gomi-shori-ken" to the items as instructed.
 3 Put them out on the designated day.

Oversized garbage should be about 10~100kg of weight and smaller than 2 meters on a side.

- Bicycles
- Large furniture
- Carpets (6-jo and larger)
Kiddie cars are Burnable garbage
- Large-sized heaters (with chimney, FF-type)
